CHILD GUIDANCE CENTER ANNOUNCES NEW BOARD MEMBERS

Deluca received her bachelor's degree in psychology, *cum laude*, from Princeton University and her J.D, *cum laude*, from Georgetown University Law Center.

In this role she is responsible for all client sectors for Institutional size trading for Precious Metals. Giordano-Powers was the first female trader for Swiss Bank in the America's and has often been a guest on CNBC's "Round Table", and was a featured speaker on CNBC's American Stock Exchange precious metals update.

Rosenthal, a resident of Weston, is a consultant for Morgan's Hotel Group. For nearly a decade, Rosenthal built and opened several restaurants in New York City, which included the dispensation of over \$30M in build-out capital. Prior to his restaurant and consulting career, he held a fellowship at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center doing bone marrow cancer research. Graduating from Yale with a degree in Psychobiology, Rosenthal serves as a college admissions interviewer for the Yale College Admissions office.
